<p>STRENGTHS: *We recognize that truant students are rushing through makeup work, which does not lead to mastery. We are looking at ways to address this challenge.</p> <p>*The goal of assessing results/data is not always mastery. Sometimes the need requires reteaching and remediation to attain mastery.</p> <p>*The PLC process is becoming more positive and efficient. We can plan learning objectives as a grade-level team, and still differentiate the level of difficulty for our own classrooms.</p>	<p>STRENGTHS: *We recognize that our assessments may be too easy, which can cause lower than desired expectations. Keeping assessments rigorous increases expectations by default!</p> <p>*This time of the year requires stamina, seeking solutions, and getting creative with problem solving..</p> <p>*We are learning that there is flexibility with this process. If our students aren't ready to be assessed, we can make the decision to wait another week to assess.</p>	<p>STRENGTHS: As we move into March and April we will continue to collect data and measure achievement of weekly goals, but we will begin looking at essential components necessary to meet grade level expectation.
