If our students aren't ready to be assessed, we can make the decision to wait another week to assess.</p>	<p>STRENGTHS: As we move into March and April we will continue to collect data and measure achievement of weekly goals, but we will begin looking at essential components necessary to meet grade level expectation. <p>GOALS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Create proficiency and consistency by cross-examining data sets as well as what is observed in the classroom. *The goal is to learn where your students are at, to meet them where they're at, and to reflect on our craft of teaching. *Make sure that objectives are identified first, and assessments are chosen second versus the other way around. Ensure that objectives align to a Colorado State Standard. *Differentiate objectives to reflect the formative data revealing achievement levels for each classroom. *Ensure that objectives are created before the assessments. *Increase the use of academic language through dialogue with students (Think: Bloom's verbs, and content rich vocabulary). 	<p>GOALS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Ask the question: "What barriers can I remove or need to be removed," in order to move 'stuck' students forward. Make learning meaningful! How can we apply lessons to students' reality/real world? *Truly use this process to identify the needs, focus intentionality of the lesson, and assess the results. This can be applied to academic or behavioral needs and goals, or both. *Keeping high expectations will increase student output... If we want three paragraphs, require five. * Expand what we are learning through literacy into other lessons. Continue to work toward bringing the Learning Agenda into lesson planning format. *Get creative with making assessments more manageable (i.e. instead of assessing the entire class with a page long writing assignment, assess 4 students a day with a one page assignment, or assess the entire 	<p>GOALS:</p> <p>Coming back from Spring Break we would like to continue with data monitoring, but begin focusing on the planning for next year.
